

Dimos Fotopoulos, MD MA (Bioethics)

Dimos Fotopoulos is an addiction psychiatrist, vice president of the Greek Organization Against Drugs (OKANA). After obtaining an MD degree from the University of Patras (1993) he had Psychiatric Residency training (1996-2001) in Chania and in Athens, Greece. In 2005 he completed a Master's Degree in Bioethics at the University of Crete (Thesis: Personal responsibility in drug use; rational choice, disease or socially constructed behavior?) and in 2006 he completed the Postgraduate Training Program in Social Planning and Policy in the Field of Drug Addiction from Therapy Center for Dependent Individual (KETHEA) and National School of Public Health, Greece.

He has worked as Director (2003-2015) of the Addiction Unit and the Multiple Intervention Program in Rethymnon, Greece. From 2015 onwards as Vice-president of the Greek Organization Against Drugs (OKANA) is responsible for training, planning interventions in the prevention field, designing new programs, implementing best practices guidelines and monitoring the effectiveness of such programs.

Dimos Fotopoulos is a smoking cessation trainer in Greek Thoracic Society since 2008 and in European Respiratory Society (ERS) since 2015. He is also representing Greece in EU's Committee on National Alcohol Policy and Action (CNAPA).
